



& Guardian Scholars Application

EOPS would like to congratulate you for taking the steps to get additional support to help you succeed at Mt. SAC. While we aspire to serve as many Mt. SAC students as possible, EOPS program regulations require that the students we serve meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units:
- Qualify to receive the College Promise Grant (formerly known as the Board of Governors Fee Waiver (BOGW)
 under method A, B, or C with a \$0 Expected Family Contribution (EFC));
- Be a California resident or qualify as a California Dream Act Student;
- 4. Have earned fewer than 40 degree applicable units with a 2.00 GPA; and
- Meet with an EOPS Counselor three times each semester while enrolled in the program.

*If you are a current/former foster you, you may not have to meet the criteria above. Please submit your application in order for our NextUp/Guardian Scholars staff to review your eligibility."






The NextUp program, formerly known as Cooperating Agencies Foster Youth Educational Support (CAFYES), began legally operating in January 2016 after the Board of Governors selected 10 districts to implement NextUp and became a part of Education Code 79220 - 79229 in 2014.



NextUp was created to support foster youth students seeking to further their educational career in California's Community College system by providing "over, above, and in addition to" services and support including more intensive care and academic support



Recent Education Code changes include student eligibility requirements and additional funds to expand services and support to 115 colleges in 2022.

NextUp students are EOPS students too!

Age Requirement

Be under the age of 26 at the commencement of the academic year in which the student first enrolls in the program

02

Foster Youth Status

Be a current or former foster youth, who was in care on or after the youth's 13th birthday

The NextUp Program may provide services, and direct financial support, to enrolled students who meet all eligibility requirements but whose courses have not commenced yet, and who have completed the required matriculation activities, if services are necessary to enable the student to be successful upon the commencement of the academic term.





February 2023

State Chancellor's Office awards, Mt. SAC 1.52 million for 2022-23

March 2023

100+ students are identified as being eligible.

April 2023
