

Resolution 2015 – 05
Creation of a CTE Liaison Position

Whereas, the Academic Senate is the organization whose primary function is to make recommendations with respect to academic and professional matters (Title 5, 53200), and is primarily relied upon for curriculum, degree and certificate requirements, education program development, and policies related to grading, student preparation and success, and faculty professional development (Board Policy 3255); and,

Whereas, in Resolution 17.02 adopted at the Spring 2015 plenary session, the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) “urge[d] local academic senates to identify a CTE faculty member to act as a liaison to facilitate communication among local CTE faculty, the local academic senate, and the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges;”

Resolved, the Academic Senate create a CTE Liaison position to be appointed to a two-year term by the Academic Senate President and confirmed by the Academic Senate; and

Resolved, the CTE Liaison’s responsibilities shall be: to attend meetings of the Academic Senate; to provide reports to the Academic Senate as needed about statewide issues of concern in CTE; to identify local and regional CTE issues of concern; to communicate opportunities for CTE faculty to participate in statewide initiatives, workgroups, and task forces; to attend, as funding permits, state-level events and regional consortia meetings; and to advise the Academic Senate President and Executive Board on CTE issues.
