Sampat	Report on SLO completion as of August 2016. This information will be shared with Academic Senate, and Joumana will share it with Deans. <b>Accepted.</b>  AP 4020 requires faculty to have a 2-year course rotation schedule. J. Vitullo shared his schedule rotation . This Council recommends rotation schedules be placed in the Department’s websites and be made available and visible to students. Michelle Sampat will provide this as an information item with John Vitullo’s schedule as an example. <b>Accepted</b>  The Chancellor’s Office (CO) will allow modified courses, new courses, stand-alone courses, substantial modifications, and minor changes to courses to be locally certified. The CO will generate a new control number automatically. This will prevent a review backlog. Courses needing C-ID, gen ed, or transfer approval will still need to be submitted to reviewers as usual. New courses on new programs will still be reviewed at the CO. The new system will not be in effect immediately. It may be implemented next spring or fall. 	Interdisciplinary Degree Recommendation – M. Sampat	<p>This issue mostly affects the area of emphasis degrees. What department owns them? Who is responsible for SLOs and reviews? If an interdisciplinary program should be modified, does every person or department representative involved in its original task force convene? What if someone is merely adding a course to an interdisciplinary degree? Does every department have to meet and provide input on whether or not it should be accepted?</p> <p>Unless there is an established process on how to resolve this situation we can't offer guidance.</p> <p>Joumana suggested consulting other colleges to see how they are dealing with similar situations.</p> <p>There isn't an AP that calls the creation of a task force every time an interdisciplinary degree is modified, therefore a fair process is needed</p> <p>Joumana, Michelle, Emily, John, and Jean will work together during the winter to bring a recommendation forward.</p>	
	Interdisciplinary Course Review – M. Sampat	<p>What is an interdisciplinary course?
