Holds a Master's Degree in Music Education. Holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Performance. The Master's Degree only includes 8 units in Ethnic Studies, but they are not specific to Asian American Studies.

 3. Candidate 3 Ph.D. in Religion. Foreign Master's Degree in Korean Studies. Master's Degree in Theology. Bachelor's Degree in Theology. Master's Degree in American History with concentrations in African American and Native American History (Anticipated Summer 2024) Based on precedent, the equivalency committee cannot confer equivalency since the projected completion date of the required master's degree is after the hiring date. The committee has not received transcripts for this degree in progress. Denied.
 4. Candidate 4 Bachelor's Degree in Chicana/o Studies. Master's Degree in Chicana/o & Latina/o studies (pending Spring

2023) Transcripts confirm that 39 units of graduate coursework is complete. This candidate is finalizing approval of their Thesis. Based on precedent, this candidate meets minimum qualifications as long as their degree posts by the hire date.
 5. Candidate 5 Bachelor's Degree in English Education. Master's Degree in History. Specialization in Colonialism and Empire. This candidate submitted the following coursework for approval through Equivalency: (Note: these are quarter units totaling to 20 units when we generally look for 45 quarter units). History and Theory Exploring historiography and scholarship. Colonial Latin America. 19th Century Latin America. South Asian Technology and Modernity. The City-Explorations in Urban Anthropology.

 This candidate also offered the following undergraduate courses for Equivalency, totaling to 9 semester units. Black Cultures and Personalities. Women Writers and Colonialism. Literature of Exile and Migration-South Asian Diaspora writing in English. The committee could not find enough coursework to justify equivalency in Ethnic Studies. 6. Candidate 6
 Ph.D. in Education, Culture, and Society. Master's Degree in Education, Culture and Society. Bachelor's Degree in Chicana/o Studies and Sociology. The committee found 15 units of coursework equivalent to graduate level Ethnic Studies classes. The candidate's research and dissertation work is in Chicana/o studies. These units total to over 12 graduate level units if we include the research component.

The committee decided that this
candidate meets equivalency.
