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- This document is nothing new; however, this is one document that will have all of this information in one place.
- We as a committee might want to propose that we have one plan that we use to drive our work, the Strategic Plan.
- We haven't laid out how it should happen. We have goals in the Comprehensive Master Plan.
- We have a plan. Why do we need another plan?
- It should be one plan. Dr. Garcia has stated that she wants DEISA+ at the core of all our work.
- Our Comprehensive Plan will need to be looked at, and everything will need to be looked at through the DEISA+ lens.
- EFMP and Strategic Plan have very different descriptors. We would need to combine them.
- The Strategic Plan is our plan for the next 10 years. Do we need a more detailed plan? Should this be part of the EFMP or will this be a separate plan or go to PAC to merge them?

- The AP/BP 3250 Institutional Planning, we are supposed to, together with EPAC, focus on elements of our plan. We haven't necessarily been following this.
   This is an opportunity for guidance.
   It is clear that we have a Strategic Plan, and then the focus plan works on the detailed plans.
  - We should form a formal recommendation to PAC. If we want to do that, we should state that we don't need a strategic plan.
  - We could keep what we have, and then in the evaluation of the handbook, we have a process for allowing for annual updates.
  - Some changes we have been making don't have definitions for everything.
  - We wouldn't want to change it to Master Plan since we are not yet ready to transition.
  - Instead, submit this as our vision. This is how we are seeing
    it.
  - Otherwise, we are not making it a grand idea, and the update may not happen.
  - IEC can make a recommendation.
  - Then we could have this conversation in the taskforce.
  - The Strategic Plan may already be out of date. IEC works on this plan.
  - Is now one small group determining our big overarching plan for the campus? This is going to be the thought of many people.
  - For the Strategic Master Plan, we conducted listening sessions, and other ways were used to garner feedback. We would do something similar.
  - Since we are currently looking into hiring external companies to help us with this. When will the recommendation reach Dr. Garcia? This information should be part of the vetting process for these firms.
  - PAC meets next Wednesday and one of the IEC chairs can attend that meeting to share this.
  - The draft that I shared with you today will be with Dr. Garcia by then, however, it is a draft so she may or may not share it.
  - The current document shows two plans, not one, so that is a concern.
