

SABBATICAL LEAVE REPORT

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

I. Summary of study, research and travel completed while on Sabbatical Leave.

- A. A total of approximately 24,000 miles were traveled by car and 20,000 miles by air. Countries visited were Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, and the South Pacific islands of Tahiti, Bora Bora, Raitea and Moorea.
- B. A majority of the time and travel was concentrated in Australia. A total of over 23,000 miles by car and 4,600 miles by air were completed here. Travel was mainly conducted in the Eastern half of Australia. Most of the major ecological habitats present were visited. These included visits to the following major plant communities: Grasslands, Mangrove Forests, Alpine Forests, Mallee, Mulga, Schlerophyllic and Hydrophyllic Eucalypt Forests, Dry Desert, Heathland, and Tropical Rainforests. Visits were also made to various islands along the coast of Australia. Three months were spent on the unique Great Barrier Reef region and extensive collecting and study was carried out.
- C. Visits were also made to the islands of New Zealand, Fiji, Tahiti, Bora Bora, Raitea, and Moorea. Extensive prior reading and research was conducted before the visits and field-trips were conducted in these areas to survey the flora and fauna.
- D. Emphasis of study was heavily upon Ornithological aspects. A total of 452 species of birds were observed on the trip. A complete list of Australian birds (432 species) and where they were first observed is attached to this report. Many evolutionarily unique groups were observed such as: Parrots (30 species), Bower Birds (8 species), Honeyeaters (42 species), Mound-building birds (3 species), flightless birds (Emu and Cassowary), Lyrebirds (both existing species), one species of Penguins, and 2 relatives of the New Guinea Birds-of-Paradise.
- E. Emphasis was also upon many unique mammals. The following mammals were studied in natural habitats: Wallabies and Kangaroos (10 species), Bandicoots, Koalas, Wombats, Fruit Bats, Sugar Gliders, and Spiny Anteaters.
- F. Extensive photographic studies were conducted. Over 3,000 Kodachrome slides of wildlife and ecological habitats were taken. Approximately 8,000 ft. of 16mm color movie film was taken. These will be used in my teaching and all were taken at my own expense.
- G. Special trips were made to many national parks, sanctuaries, faunal reserves, museums, research stations, ornithological societies, and universities. A complete list is attached. Valuable personal contacts were made with many fine people at these institutions.

II. Statement of how the sabbatical leave will help me render more effective service to the college.

- A. The sabbatical leave has been very productive to me in the following ways:
1. Increased the breadth and depth of my biological background.
  2. Exposed me to a very different group of plants and animals.
  3. Exposed me to many new and unique ecological habitats, such as the Great Barrier Reef.
  4. As a result of visiting islands close to Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, and several islands in the South Pacific, I now have a better understanding of the evolutionary forces involved in species formation. This should enable me to do a more effective job in teaching this to my students.
  5. Exposed me to many evolutionarily unique organisms. With direct experiences with these endemic organisms, I will be better able to explain their significance to my students.
  6. The slides and movies will be very valuable and effective teaching aids in my classes.
- B. I have also obtained indirect information that has effected me in various ways. I am now able to evaluate our systems of education, government, and social values more objectively. Through comparison with other value systems, I have come to a better understanding and appreciation of our own way of life in America. I have also learned that there are other modes of existence than our own, and other avenues of solving problems that are successful.

In summation, I would like to say that this sabbatical leave was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. This experience has had many direct and indirect positive effects upon my ability as a teacher. Through associations with the many fine people of Australia, I have been changed in many respects that are subtle and difficult to explain. The end result is that I feel I have gained a much deeper and broader world perspective.
