AB 1096 Background

Introduced by Assembly Member Mike Fong as 22-23 legislation

Cal. Ed. Code § 30 approved by the Governor in October 2023:

- A community college may offer courses taught in languages other than English.
- Students may enroll in these courses without being required to concurrently enroll in an English as a Second Language (ESL) course (amendment).

Already in place and evolving in other community college districts

SCE Noncredit Faculty Workgroup

Based on noncredit faculty and area interest, a workgroup of SCE faculty (adjunct and full-time) and managers was formed to address the following:

1. Identify Potential noncredit courses

2. Implementation

- Methodologies, curriculum
- Best practices
- Strategies for a successful adoption
- Research other colleges that have implemented monolingual instruction

3. Equity and Access

- Ensuring equitable access for unserved or underserved adult learners
- Benefits to students



SCE Interest in Monolingual Noncredit Classes

SCE faculty interest exists in these noncredit disciplines/courses:

- Education for Older Adults: Healthy Aging
- Short-term Vocational: Computer Literacy
- Adult Basic Education: HS Equivalency Preparation (GED)

Equitable pathways and benefits to students

- Increased enrollment of adult learners
- Address regional gap in serving adult learners who are unserved or underserved in terms of educational opportunities and career pathways
- Promote English language acquisition
- Increase the number of adults over 25 without high school credentials
