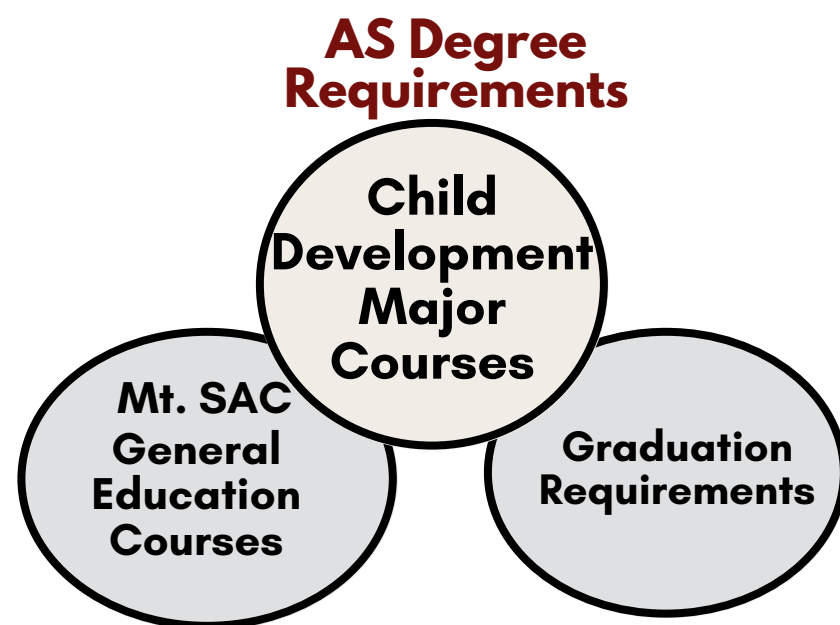

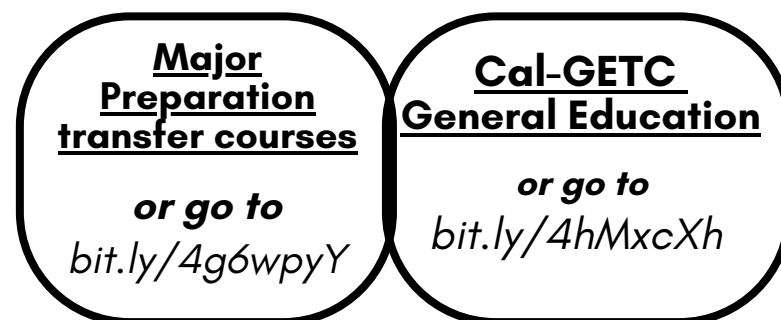

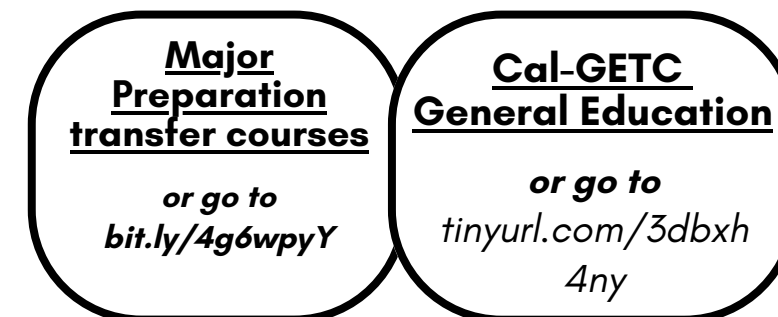

# Permits

## WHAT IS A CHILD DEVELOPMENT PERMIT?

The **Child Development Permit** is a certification issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC). This permit is granted to individuals with specific educational and work experience requirements. It authorizes individuals to teach or supervise child development programs, such as preschools, childcare centers, and other early childhood education settings. The permit supports a career ladder for those pursuing work in early childhood education.
