

President's Cabinet Action Notes December 9, 2025

1. Cabinet reviewed and commented on the following standing items:
 - a. Marketing and Public Affairs provided the following updates:
 - The Mountie Food Pantry was featured on NBC 4 and Telemundo. A student and Martha highlighted the importance of basic needs support for our students.
 - Martha appeared on NBC 4 for News Conference with Conan Nolan discussing Mt. SAC noncredit education.
 - Madelyn was featured on Spectrum News One related to noncredit education. Students from the EMT and electronics programs were also featured.
 - Foothill Transit partnered with Rising Scholars on an art and graffiti workshop that brought creativity and community together. During the event, participants in the Rising Scholars program were invited to explore the history and techniques of graffiti art, highlighting the cultural significance of street art.
 - A collaboration between Foothill Transit and the Mt. SAC Foundation collected hundreds of toys for the children at Casa Colina. Toys will be distributed next week.
 - Mt. SAC will have representation from High School Outreach Programs and SCE at the annual Walnut Winter event.
 - Marketing is focused on the end of the year and planning for the new year. Planning includes rethinking graphic design requests. The team is reviewing Mt. SAC 2035 and reassessing the messaging used in communications, ensuring that the information is healing-centered focused.
