Subject: Senate position revaluation Date: 4/23/2020

Whereas: Section 5 of Article III states, “No Mt. SAC student can be re-elected or appointed to the same position. No Mt. SAC student can serve as an A.S. Officer for more than four semesters regardless of the position(s) held.”

Whereas: It is important for every position to have an officer that is passionate in what they do. The change they wish to see is expressed through what they do with the office they hold. Therefore, each senate position needs a senator that has a calling for that particular area of service.

Whereas: Whenever a senator is forced to change their title, after every two semesters, it is likely that the position they listed as second on their application will not be available.
