**What are your weaknesses:** Choose a real weakness but frame it positively by discussing how you are actively working to improve it. Provide an example of steps you've taken or strategies you've implemented to overcome this weakness

**Why should we hire you:** Summarize your unique qualifications, skills, and experiences that make you a strong fit for the role. Highlight how you can add value to the team and contribute to the company's success based on what you've learned about their needs during the interview process.

**Describe a challenge you faced at work:** Use the STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result) to describe a specific challenge you encountered, what actions you took to address it, and what outcomes resulted from those actions. This structured approach helps convey your problem-solving abilities effectively.

**Where do you see yourself in five years:** Discuss realistic career aspirations that align with the position you're applying for while showing ambition and commitment to growth within the company or industry. Emphasize how this role fits into your long-term plans without being overly specific about titles or positions that may not be available in that timeframe.
