Working with DLAs

Pro-tips for using them in your curriculum!

DLAs (or Directed Learning Activities) are great ways to supplement student learning. They are in-depth informational resources on specific writing, grammar, and research topics that allow students the chance to practice their skills with guided activities at the end.

While DLAs are helpful for students in their learning process, they are not meant to help them master a skill but rather to provide them with an introductory understanding of a topic, concept, technique, etc. Therefore, DLAs are always best used in conjunction with a lesson you have gone over in class!

Tips for assigning DLAs:

1. **Staggering multiple DLA due dates** is helpful because students can plan their tutoring appointments ahead of time. This also helps alleviate any backed up WC traffic we sometimes experience when classes assign DLAs to be due the same week they were assigned.
2. We also suggest assigning **no more than 1 DLA per week**. When multiple classes have more than 1 DLA due in a week, it causes high drop-in wait times that we can't always accommodate due to our limited staffing (unfortunately, we only have so many tutors).
3. If you have a DS (Dedicated Writing Specialist) in your class, please consider sending students to a **group DLA session with your DS!**
4. We update our DLAs frequently to make them better, more accurate, etc., so to make sure you are assigning the current version, **always download them from our website!**

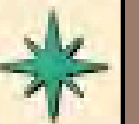
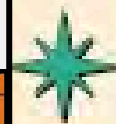

Asynchronous Feedback

The Writing Center's Asynchronous Feedback feature is a service that we provide to try to accommodate for busy, asynchronous students who don't always have the time or means to meet with a tutor synchronously. This service is designed to help students improve their writing. Students can receive help in recognizing recurrent errors, finding ways to organize ideas, and becoming better at identifying how to improve their writing. It works best for complete or near complete essay drafts! Our Writing Specialists receive training on how to give this kind of feedback, and our Support Staff always do a quality check before feedback is sent back to students.
